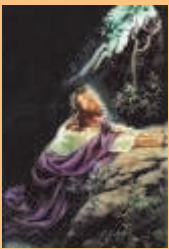

Purple Cloth

The Purple Cloth that covers the statues and crucifixes in church will remain until Holy Saturday. The church will be decorated at 9am for Easter. Please join us.

Deacon Trevor Fernandes stated in his homily on Monday for 40 Hours Devotion that the Church traditionally covers the statues and crucifixes from Passion Sunday (the Sunday before Palm Sunday) to Holy Saturday. Holy Mother Church is now the Sorrowful Mother in anticipation of the Lord's Passion. She shields our eyes out of mercy from the horror of the brutality of the Lord's Passion and the Cross.

Deacon Trevor also said that we are shielded from the sight of the saints to focus on Jesus. But, the saints are present, especially at every Holy Mass, to guide us, protect us, and to intercede for us. So, this in a sense is a penance for our eyes, it also is to deepen our faith that the saints are with us whether we can see them or not.

Deacon Trevor also reflected on the covering of the images in the context of 40 Hours Devotion. This helps us to focus on Jesus exposed in the Blessed Sacrament, so that we can draw closer to our Lord. Though we cannot see Him, we know by faith that Jesus is truly present Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. He is truly there waiting for us to come to Him and be with Him.

† Our Sacramental Policy †

Six-month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage.

Baptisms: Second Sunday of the month; Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requires that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic; and the Godparents must be active, practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If two Godparents: must be 1 male & 1 female; if one Godparent: may be male or female.

Marriage: Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Please call the rectory office. Officiate at the ceremony must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Funerals: Officiate must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Please note: The services of the Parish Organist are used for all sacramental liturgies.

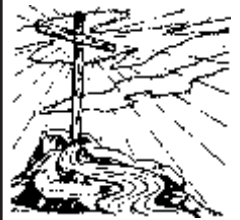

St. Anthony Catholic Cemetery Conditions and Limitations:

- ◆ The said lot(s) shall be used only as a place of burial for human remains and for no other purpose.
- ◆ No interments shall take place in St. Anthony Cemetery, except by the sexton of St. Anthony Church, or his designate.
- ◆ No interment shall be allowed in said lot of any person not a member of the family without the written consent of the name stated on the certificate of burial.
- ◆ The Church retains the right to refuse Christian burial to any individual who is so barred by Church and Canon Law.
- ◆ All markers and monuments are subject to prior approval. A blueprint of the Marker/Monument must be submitted to the Parish Office for review, prior to ordering.
 - A crucifix must appear on each memorial and be the prominent image.
 - Any other image must be submitted for review and approval by the Cemetery Committee.
 - Only Sacred Scripture, or a quote from a Saint are permitted for inscriptions.
 - Any image or inscription considered by the Cemetery Committee to be offensive or in violation of the dignified and reverent nature of the cemetery grounds will not be permitted.
 - All monuments/markers must be within the following dimensions:
 - For single grave markers: ----- **not to exceed 36" wide, 12" deep, 36 " high**
 - For double grave markers: ----- **not to exceed 48" wide, 12" deep, 36 " high**
- ◆ Placing and erection of monuments or foundations, planting of trees and shrubbery, placing of fences or anything of a permanent nature is not permitted.
- ◆ **No objects may be "glued" to any headstone.**
- ◆ Nothing should be placed on the grave which would make the upkeep of the cemetery difficult or impossible.
- ◆ Private reselling of plots is not permitted; any unwanted plots may be sold back to the Parish for the original purchase price.

Rules for St. Anthony Cemetery

Updated February 26, 2013

St. Anthony Cemetery Committee

- ◆ One of the following decorations is permitted per grave: One eternal light; *or* one cemetery cone with plants or flowers, real or artificial (permitted Easter – Thanksgiving only); *or* a grave blanket or pillow (permitted Thanksgiving – April 1 only); *or* one arrangement affixed with a headstone saddle, permitted year round.
- ◆ Cones or vases integral to the headstone design and permanently attached to the base are permitted.
- ◆ A single American flag and/or VFW military marker is also permitted.
- ◆ Funeral Flowers are to be removed by the family no later than 3 days after the funeral.
- ◆ Decorations which do not conform to the above specifications will be removed.
- ◆ Please place all refuse in the containers provided.
- ◆ Please close the Cemetery gate when leaving.

St. Anthony Catholic Church reserves the right to remove any decoration not in compliance with the stated rules and regulations or otherwise deemed not appropriate.
