

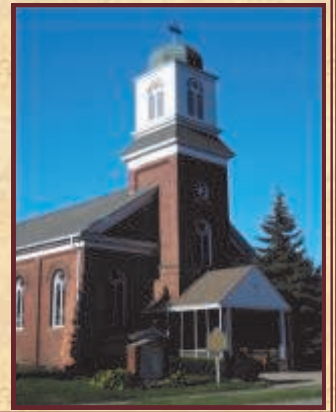

Pastoral Letter on Funerals

On Divine Mercy Sunday, we included as an insert Archbishop Vigneron’s pastoral letter on the Order of Christian Funerals called “In Union with Christ’s Dying and Rising: Our Catholic funeral rites as a sharing in the Pascal Mystery.”

In the cover letter written to his priests, Archbishop Vigneron states his motivation for this pastoral letter stating, “many Catholics have lost a clear sense about how to face death, the importance of praying for the dead, and the consolation that our communion with the crucified and risen Jesus Christ can offer. It is my hope, then, that this pastoral letter encourages our brothers and sisters to recognize the Christian funeral as an opportunity to pray for our beloved dead and to grow closer to Christ and one another. I also hope it will encourage all of us to see clearly that the celebration of our funeral rites offer a privileged opportunity for evangelization – sharing the Good News of our salvation.”

I am glad that Abp. Vigneron issued this pastoral letter, because we are seeing more and more family members drift away from the faith. This causes many to lose sight of what the funeral rites are about, because they do not understand the doctrine of Purgatory and the need to pray for the repose of the soul of their beloved deceased.

His Excellency did reiterate that we must use Sacred Music, the Scripture Readings specified by the Church in the Lectionary, Eulogies are not permitted at Holy Mass (he encouraged these to be done after the Vigil service, cemetery, or luncheon), and the Rosary may not substitute for the Vigil Rite (it may be prayed afterwards). He did specify that Catholics must read the readings and that it would be better if the parish provided commissioned readers for this.

World Day of Prayer for Vocations April 21, 2013

The purpose of the World Day of Prayer for Vocations is to publicly fulfill the Lord’s instruction to, “Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest” (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2).

As a climax to a prayer that is continually offered throughout the Church, it affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life.

While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the *ordained ministries* (priesthood and diaconate), to the *Religious life* in all its forms (male and female, contemplative and apostolic), to *societies of apostolic life*, to *secular institutes* in their diversity of services and membership, and to the missionary life, in the particular sense of *mission “ad gentes”*.

This year marks the 50th Anniversary of the World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

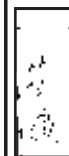

† Our Sacramental Policy †

Six-month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage.

Baptisms: Second Sunday of the month; Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requires that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic; and the Godparents must be active, practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If two Godparents: must be 1 male & 1 female; if one Godparent: may be male or female.

Marriage: Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Please call the rectory office. Officiate at the ceremony must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Funerals: Officiate must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Please note: The services of the Parish Organist are used for all sacramental liturgies.



Right to Life of Michigan was informed that the American Family Planning abortion business in Dearborn, Michigan, was closed Friday, April 12. The abortionist, 73 year old Joon-Nahm Ann, will retire.

Faithful prolife people have prayed outside this clinic for many years. Praying for mothers, their babies, and those involved in the abortion business. Prayers have been answered with this abortion business closing.

This is the 8th mill in 16 months to close here in Michigan.

Prolife Michigan lawmakers should be recognized, too. Much of 2012 was consumed by the effort to enact a series of bills to reign in the unchecked and out of control abortion industry in Michigan. House Bill 5711 was introduced as an omnibus abortion regulatory bill, combining five separate pieces of previously introduced legislation into one large bill. H.B. 5711 became known as the "Prolife Bus."

In its final form, the Prolife Bus contained a provision to require all surgical abortion facilities to be licensed and inspected. The vast majority of abortion clinics in Michigan have operated for years, even decades without ever being licensed or inspected. This will end because the law took effect at the end of March.

To bolster the implementation of this new clinic licensing law, Right to Life of Michigan worked with prolife legislators to secure funding in the current state budget to hire more health inspectors. As we proceed into 2013, there will be new prolife policies and adequate personnel in place that have never existed in our state before.

As this abortion business closes, it reminds us that each and every person can be part of our prolife movement. Many factors contribute to prolife success! www.rtl.org

Cemetery Rules

The Rules for the Cemetery were included in the Antonian a few weeks ago, but contained a few errors. The revised rules are on the back of this page. The rules stated that there must be an image of a Crucifix. A crucifix is an image of a cross with a crucified corpus (body) on in. It may not be a plain cross nor a risen Christ (since Jesus rose from the tomb not the cross – the imagery always seemed to be confusing symbols). The image of the crucifix is the symbol of our faith, which was clarified in our liturgical documents. That is why we use the Altar Cross (Crucifix) on the low altar.

Unfortunately, missing from the statement was that any additional images added to the stone must be sacred images. Any additional sacred image must be smaller than the central crucifix.

We are not grandfathering anyone into the old rules for the simple reason that when people see others stray they assume they can take liberties with the rules and add what every they want. One person went way over the top with the image and wording on their headstone, triggering the need to tighten the rules.

Another person yelled at me on the phone, because I was simply enforcing the old rules that were still very specific. One decoration was allowed. Since the family had seen other people plant flowers in the ground and place other objects around the tombstone, they decided to expand their whole area with garden pavers, etc. His question to me was “you are telling me to remove these items (which ran into the hundreds), because we didn’t follow one rule.” My simple answer was, “yes”. He couldn’t comprehend this. I couldn’t comprehend how he couldn’t.

There were more crazy phone calls and questions. The cemetery committee has been trying to be very precise, so as not to cause confusion. Even with our best efforts, people still can’t grasp these simple and precise concepts. I am not sure what else to do. We tried our best.
