

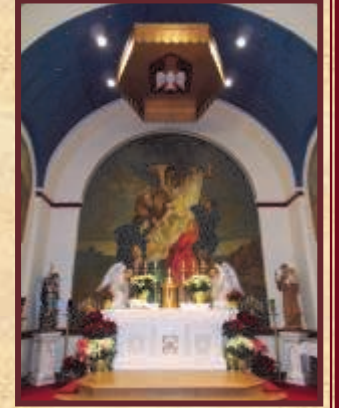

† Our Sacramental Policy †

Six-month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage.

Baptisms: Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requires that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic, and the Godparents must be active, practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If two Godparents: must be 1 male & 1 female; if one Godparent: may be male or female.

Marriage: Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Please call the rectory office. Officiate at the ceremony must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Funerals: Officiate must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Please note: The services of the Parish Organist are used for all sacramental liturgies.

Fr. Brian's Blarney
The Presentation of The Lord
- February 2



The feast of the Presentation of the Lord was originally celebrated in the Eastern Churches as "The Meeting". In the sixth century it began to be celebrated in the West, where the focus became the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary and was accompanied by solemn blessings and processions with candles; hence, it is popularly called "**Candlemas**". By the offerings of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph and the prophecy of St. Simeon, the life of Christ here begins to point toward his Resurrection.

Before each Mass next Sunday, February 2, 2014 (this includes the 5pm Sunday Vigil Mass on Saturday, Feb. 1), we will have the Blessing of Candles with either a Solemn Procession or the Solemn Entrance (much like we do at the Palm Sunday Procession). Candles that are used for Holy Mass and for the votive lights will be blessed at that time. Depending on the weather, we will either start in the narthex or in church. Ideally, the congregants would have candles lit to carry in procession or standing in the pews (much like we do at the Easter Vigil). I hope that we will be able to do this, too.

If you would like any candles for devotional use at home to be blessed, please bring them to church to be blessed along with the parish candles. If you happen to have a large number of candles, please place them in a box with your name on them, so as not to get them mixed up with the other candles. Place them next to the parish's candles and grab them after Mass.

Blessing of Throats

There will be the Blessing of Throats on the Feast of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, on **Monday, 3 Feb 2014**. It will take place at the 8:30am Mass, during Religious Ed (around 5pm), and at 7pm in church during a Liturgy of the Word (since there will not be Mass, it should take 15-20 minutes depending on attendance).
