

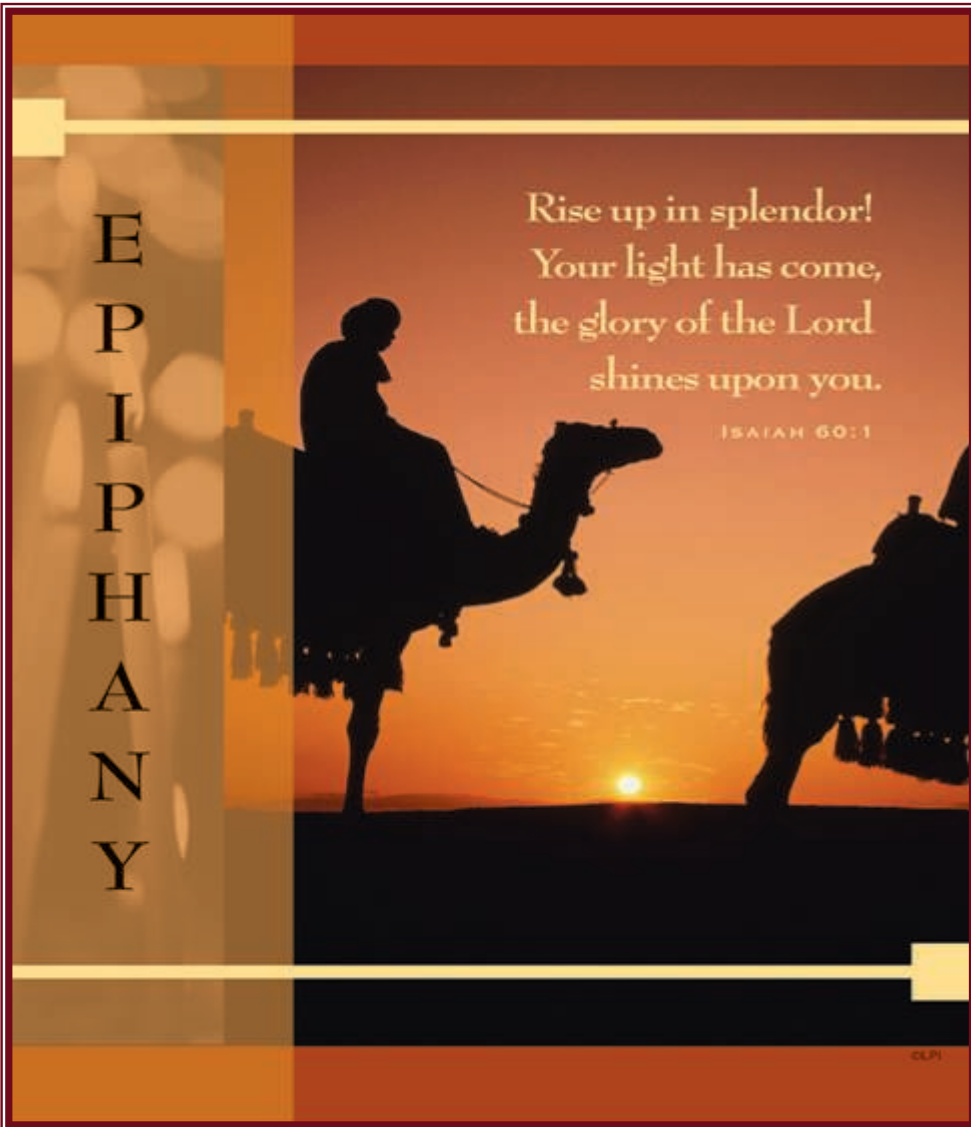
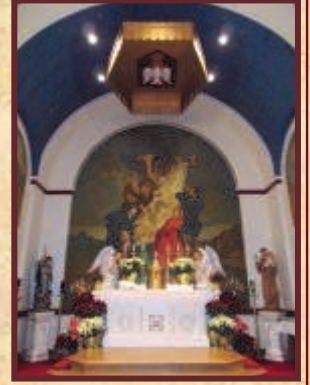

**† Our Sacramental Policy †**

Six-month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage.

**Baptisms:** Second Sunday of the month; Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requires that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic; and the Godparents must be active, practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If two Godparents: must be 1 male & 1 female; if one Godparent: may be male or female.

**Marriage:** Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Please call the rectory office. Officiate at the ceremony must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

**Funerals:** Officiate must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

**Please note:** The services of the Parish Organist are used for all sacramental liturgies.

## **Fr. Brian's Blarney**

### **Sunday without a Priest**

Archbishop Vigneron issued a letter, which I am including as an insert, (on the reverse side of this page), regarding the Sunday Service without a Priest. It was issued before Christmas, but wasn't emailed to us until Friday, 3 Jan 2014. This would have helped Fr. LaCuesta and the people of Mt. Carmel last Sunday, when he went down for the count with laryngitis and was scrambling for a priest substitute.

As you will notice, only a Liturgy of the Word is permitted to be offered. A Communion Service is not permitted in these circumstances, even if a deacon is present. The assumption is that the lay faithful were present at Mass, but due to circumstances beyond their control, whereby Mass is not offered, their obligation is waved (much like if one were sick, home bound, in the hospital or snowed in, they are not expected to do the impossible).

The Archbishop states that we are restricted to a simple Liturgy of the Word to prevent confusion. There are two reasons for this that I can think of off hand. The first, is that too often the Communion Service done in church (as opposed to the nursing home) has confused people into think that the deacon, the nun, or the lay leader offered Mass. This should be a no brainer, but I have heard often enough people comment on how the deacon or sister offered a nice Mass. I usually have to ask questions to double check and explain that it was simply a Communion Service and not Mass. Only a bishop or a priest have the ability (through ordination) to Offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and Confect this Sacrament.

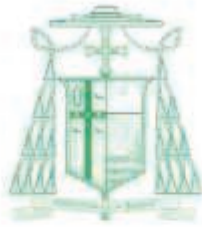
This leads to the second reason, which is that one is not to separate Communion from the Sacrifice. The primary reason for us to be at Mass is to Worship God (as opposed to ourselves, "get anything out of it", be entertained, etc.). Worship requires Sacrifice and Sacrifice requires Blood. That is why they would offer up animals in the Old Testament Worship, especially the Lamb of Sacrifice in the Temple Worship. Hence our Lord being the Lamb of Sacrifice offered at the Passover Meal under the guise of Bread and Wine and then completed on the Cross.

Jesus is both Priest and Victim - the One Who Offers and the One Who is Offered. The Last Supper is a Sacrifice before it is a meal. Once the Sacrifice is made, then it is eaten. This holds true for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, which is the unbloody Sacrifice re-presented as a perpetual memorial. It is a Commemoration meal - one that makes present the past and points to fulfillment in the future, whereby we will celebrate in the Heavenly Banquet for all eternity as seen in the Book of Revelation.

Too often the focus has been on us as the community gathered (where two or three are gathered in My Name...) and our reception of Holy Communion, causing us to lose sight of the primary reason that we were invited to Mass, namely to worship God. We have forgotten that Jesus specified how we were to worship His Father (we are offering worship, adoration, praise, and that to the Blessed Trinity). Jesus invited us and invites us to come celebrate and offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass in the power of the Holy Spirit, in union with Christ Jesus The Lord, to His Father. The priest offers up the Sacrifice in persona Christi (in the person of Christ, as head, shepherd, and spouse/bridegroom) and the Church, the Bride of Christ, in her members, unites their sacrifices with the priests. This is the Heavenly Banquet known as the Wedding Feast of the Lamb.

This is why the priest now says in the proper translation, "behold the Lamb of God, behold Him who takes away our sins. Blessed are those called to the Supper of the Lamb" and then we all respond "Lord I am not worthy that you enter under my roof, but only say they word and my soul shall be healed".

Dear Fathers,

From Apostolic times, Sunday has been the day when Christians have been gathered together by the Holy Spirit to hear God's Word and to offer sacramentally the Paschal Sacrifice of their Lord, the mystery by which the Church is constituted and sustained. As Christians we believe that we are not saved as individuals apart, but as members of the Mystical Body of Christ through his Paschal love. And so it has been important for us all to gather as that Mystical Body every Sunday in order to be renewed in that mystery, through which alone we find salvation.

Blessed John Paul II in his Apostolic Letter, *Dies Domini*, calls the Sunday assembly "*the privileged place of unity: it is the setting for the celebration of the 'sacramentum unitatis' [i.e. the Eucharist] which profoundly marks the Church as a people gathered 'by' and 'in' the unity of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.*" These words are a constant reminder of Christ's promise: "I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Mt 28:20). It is our privilege as priests to lead our people to greater faith and more profound hope each time we gather in unity as community on Sunday to celebrate the Paschal Sacrifice by which this unity is established and fostered.

I thank all of you, my brothers in Christ, for your generous and devoted service to the mystery of communion. Your love for the Eucharist and for the people I have entrusted to your care is a constant inspiration to me. I especially thank our senior priests who so readily make themselves available to celebrate the Eucharist whenever and wherever needed.

In recent times, it has become apparent that emergency situations have arisen in our Archdiocese when, unexpectedly, no priest has been available to lead the community in its Sunday celebration of the Holy Eucharist. Thankfully these are rare occasions but it has become obvious that something should be provided for when the occasion might arise. For this reason, the Archdiocesan Worship Commission has created the document: *Celebration of the Liturgy of the Word on Sundays in an Emergency Situation*. This celebration is only to be used in an actual emergency situation and not for convenience. It is not to be used for weekday celebrations of the Eucharist. In the Archdiocese of Detroit, distribution of Holy Communion is not allowed at a "Celebration of the Liturgy of the Word on Sundays in an Emergency Situation," lest there be any confusion about the nature of the Sacramental celebration which the People of Christ are called to offer to the Father on the Lord's Day. In the absence of a priest, it would be best for a deacon to lead the celebration. If no deacon is available, the celebration may be led by a trained lay person.

Even as we provide this service to be used in case of an emergency I ask that you and your community continue to pray for vocations to the priesthood. I ask that you continue to be the example of priestly holiness that will continue to attract young men to follow in your footsteps. Asking God's blessings upon you through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, I remain,
