



† Our Sacramental Policy **†**

Six-month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage.

Baptisms: Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requires that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic, and the Godparents must be active, practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If two Godparents: must be 1 male & 1 female; if one Godparent: may be male or female.

<u>Marriage:</u> Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Please call the Parish Office. Officiate at the ceremony must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Funerals: Officiate must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Please note: The services of the Parish Organist are used for all sacramental liturgies.





Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus and a great mystic in his own right, once made an intriguing statement to his young Jesuit novices. He told them that the root of the great majority of evil in the world was ingratitude. His premise was simple enough. If we truly understood how loved and blessed, we are in the sight of our loving God, the entire notion of submitting to wickedness and temptation would be unthinkable. All of the sins and transgressions that stem from greed, selfishness, entitlement and ego would seem petty in comparison to the abundant generosity of our Father in Heaven. If only we had the eyes to see beyond our concepts of injustice and spite.

Reflecting upon this principle, I was brought to consider how blessed we are as a parish. St. Anthony has received an amazing amount of generosity from the faithful and I would like to acknowledge this liberality. Thanks to the generous hearts of the faithful, we have exceeded our C.S.A. goal by more than \$10,000.00, meaning that every dollar contributed to the campaign will be returned to St. Anthony free of the Diocesan assessment (Bishop's tax) and will not be counted in the calculation for our C.S.A. goal next year.

I would like to extend a sincere thank you to the volunteer corps that has taken on the cleaning responsibilities of the parish church, as well as the volunteers who decorated our parish in anticipation of the Christmas season.

I would also like to thank the volunteers who have assisted with each of our Rummage Sales. These fundraising events have brought in a generous amount of funds to offset our prior financial difficulties and retains its reputation throughout the general region as the "best sale around". Your time, effort, and dedication has not gone unnoticed, and thanks to all of you our budget has balanced, and the facility structures look wonderful.

Thank you to our catechists, who are devoting their time to teaching our young children who are being formed in the teachings and traditions handed onto us from the Apostles.

Thank you to the musical souls that have begun to assist in the choir loft. Our liturgies have been blessed with beautiful sounds of what is developing into a polished schola. Indeed, we at St. Anthony Parish are blessed in more ways than can be listed in a brief article.

So, to all of you who have contributed to the parish via time, talent, or treasure; I extend my gratitude. The mystical body of Christ depends upon each member of the body. Similarly, the health of St. Anthony depends on all of its people. May God bless all of you abundantly for what you have done to preserve this little gem of a parish in the southern regions of the Archdiocese of Detroit.
