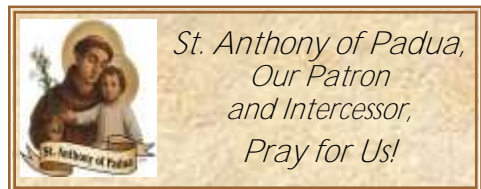

**† Our Sacramental Policy †**

Six-month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage.

**Baptisms:** Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requires that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic, and the Godparents must be active, practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If two Godparents: must be 1 male & 1 female; if one Godparent: may be male or female.

**Marriage:** Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Please call the Parish Office. Officiate at the ceremony must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

**Funerals:** Officiate must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

**Please note:** The services of the Parish Organist are used for all sacramental liturgies.

## Notes of Moderation - May 5, 2024

Of all the various apparitions that have occurred in the recent past, the visions of Fatima stand out among them for the influence they have brought. While the message of Fatima was simple, "Pray and do penance for the conversion of sinners", it retains a depth for the insights that the "secrets" presented to the hearts of the faithful. While Our Lady did speak of the dangers of modernity to some extent, one of the most piercing prophetic statements seems particularly relevant to our current society.

So says Cardinal Carlo Caffarra, who reports that the visionary Sr. Lucia sent him a letter to this effect when he was Archbishop of Bologna, Italy. The Cardinal had been commissioned by Saint John Paul II to plan and establish the Pontifical Institute for Studies on Marriage and Family. At the beginning of this work, the cardinal wrote a letter to Sister Lucia of Fatima. Surprisingly, the Cardinal received a reply. "Inexplicably, since I did not expect a reply, seeing as I had only asked for her prayers, I received a long letter with her signature, which is now in the archives of the Institute," the Italian cardinal said.

"In that letter we find written: 'The final battle between the Lord and the kingdom of Satan will be **about Marriage and the Family.**' Don't be afraid, she added, because whoever works for the sanctity of Marriage and the Family will always be fought against and opposed in every way, because this is the decisive issue. Then she concluded: 'nevertheless, Our Lady has already crushed his head'." Cardinal Caffarra added that "speaking again with John Paul II, you could feel that the family was the core, since it has to do with the supporting pillar of creation, the truth of the relationship between man and woman, between the generations. If the foundational pillar is damaged, the entire building collapses and we're seeing this now, because we are right at this point and we know it."

The Church has consistently held that the family is not a simple institution of human convenience or some construct of society and culture. The family is the fundamental cell of human society and the foundation of every culture and nation. The spiritual and societal well being of the family directly effects the well being of every nation and society as a whole. Furthermore, in the divine plan of salvation, the family is the domestic church. The home is the first school of prayer, the house of formation for young Christian souls, and chapel of devotional life. Every attack against the family, against its dignity and integrity, is an attack against the Church and our Lord's salvific plan.

While I could easily write several articles on the contemporary aggression against the family structure, it may be more helpful to look toward elements that serve to build up the family. Beginning on the 21<sup>st</sup> of June, the Lumen Christi Family of Parish will be hosting a 'Family Retreat' at the campus of St. Joseph Parish in Erie. This retreat will be directed by the Canons of the Holy Cross brothers and their counterpart community—The Sister of the Holy Cross. The retreat will include separate spiritual talks for various age levels which includes presentations for the parents.; a rich devotional practice that will introduce the participants to some aspects of monastic spirituality and the devotions to the angels of God for which the Canons are known. It should be an excellent opportunity for the families within our parishes to spend time with faithful religious and consider how our families can grow in faith together. There will also be ample time for community interaction and fun.

While the retreat is aimed at families with younger children, it is open to couples and single people of all ages. I would encourage anyone with a desire to grow in their faith and with a concern for how we can build our family into the thriving 'domestic cells' of the mystical body of Christ to consider this opportunity.

May Our Lord abundantly bless the Lumen Christi Family of Parishes and each and every family within our Parishes.

### We Can Prepare the Upper Room

We all know that person, don't we? Hey, maybe we've even been that person. "I have a great relationship with God, but I don't go to church regularly. God and I are on good terms. I can talk to Him just fine on my own."

There isn't anything false in these statements. It's important to have an intimate, even conversational prayer relationship with God. But the problem with this attitude is that it implies that churches don't matter. Community worship doesn't matter. Today, we are reminded exactly why that is so untrue. Why we need our parishes, our priests, and each other.

The Body and Blood of Christ — that's what it's all about. If it's not about that, it's not about anything. If we don't have the Eucharist, we're just like the ancient priests, making sacrifices that don't have the power to redeem anybody.

Where do we receive the Body and Blood of Christ? For most of us, it's in our parishes. The altar of sacrifice is also the table we gather in front of, as a family, to become one with Christ in the truest and realest way possible, recreating the scene in the Upper Room over and over again every time Mass is celebrated.

The disciples were commissioned by Christ to prepare the Upper Room for the Last Supper. How can we take up that work ourselves? How can we strengthen the bonds in our spiritual family? How can we serve our parish, always remembering that the table is not meant to be set only for two?
